Cokesbury Reaches Out To A Sister Church After Hurricane Hits

Thanks to all of you who gave to the Founder's Day event this year, we collected over \$3000.00. In years past, we purchased items for our church to enhance our worship, but this year our hearts were touched as we witnessed churches, destroyed by Hurricane Katrina, conduct worship services with little more than a 2 X 4 laid across two sawhorses for an alter.

Rather than look inward at what we could buy for ourselves, Cokesbury UMC decided to reach out to one of our sister churches on the gulf coast to help rebuild what nature has torn apart. To do that, the Seashore District Superintendent's office in Mississippi was contacted and asked to provide us with a church to help recover from Hurricane Katrina and the money that was collected will be sent to them in order to help with the rebuilding process.

The church is Mount Zion United Methodist Church located in Gulfport MS. The money is a small gift when you look at the grand scale of things, but we can also help in other ways, such as sending letters, cards and notes of encouragement to the congregation of Mount Zion UMC and let them know that they are in our thoughts and prayers. New on the web site in September we began offering the convenience of online tithes and offerings. This new area provides you with information for 'Distance Giving' including direct donations, repeating bank drafts, and mailing info.

The direct donation method allows you to give using a credit card and will incur a 5% surcharge to cover the processing cost. This charge is required to help the processing company cover its costs of maintaining the system. So, if you give \$100, \$95 will go to Cokesbury and \$5 will go to the processing company.




"All of My Life"
